
# and the earth sighed Josephine Starrs & Leon Cmielewski

#### Artist's Notes

Our aim is to re-imagine the relationship between nature and culture by presenting aerial views of Australian landscapes and waterways dynamically manipulated in ways that reveal their underlying fragility. The result is an immersive video and sound environment that encourages reflection on our relationship to nature and technology.

We encourage the viewer to ascend stairs to a platform where they can view the large-scale floor projections from above. The camera drifts across degraded landscapes and rolling sand hills, seeking out the fragile interfaces, the edges, between lands lost to the desert and land fending off the relentless encroachment of sand and fire.

The audience can then descend into the floor projections where their bodies are immersed in the moving landscapes, embedded with symbols and text. The intention is to configure the land as active and to imagine it being able to speak and make comment about human impacts upon it. We worked with Alex Davies to create an immersive ambient soundscape that fosters engagement and contemplation about the impact of climate change on natural ecologies.

Their recent project *Dancing with Drones*, with dancer Alison Plevey, explores human responses to drone technologies, recording site specific performances in natural and industrial locations. It was performed at Liveworks, Performance Space in 2015, at Siteworks, Bundanon in 2014 and was shown at the 2015 International Symposium on Electronic Art in Vancouver, Canada.

Their artwork *Incompatible Elements*, focusing on landscapes in crisis due to climate change, has been shown in Australia, USA, Taiwan, Korea, NZ, and in the Maldives Pavilion at the 2013 Venice Biennale. Their previous work *Seeker*, a four-screen installation focusing on asylum seekers, mapping and diaspora, won an Award of Distinction in Interactive Art at the 2007 Prix Ars Electronica, Austria.

Leon Cmielewski is a Senior Lecturer at the School of Humanities and Communication Arts, Western Sydney University; and Josephine Starrs is Honorary Senior Lecturer at Sydney College of the Arts, University of Sydney.
