ABOUT FRAUDULENT BEHAVIOUR

NOT A MIKE LEIGH FILM

In 2004 I shared a table in a cheap Chinese restaurant with a middle agedman. He was tall and thin. We knew each other a little, but not all that well. He'd invited me for lunch. We ate from red plastic plates patterned with the Chinese character for Longevity. We spent about 2 hours together. It was mainly he who spoke. He spoke of secrets and lies; just like the Mike Leigh film, only his stories didn't star Brenda Blethyn.

During the course of our lunch date he told me that the supply of truth far outweighed the demand, an observation first espoused by the humorist Josh Billings (aka Henry Wheeler Shaw); "As scarce as truth is, the supply has always been in excess of the demand."

That night I made a few notes about our conversation and four years later I began making **Fraudulent Behaviour**.

HUNTING FOR A DECOY

Research for the show took a number of different forms including a formal survey offered to strangers (in which 97 people took part), targeted questions to people I

knew (of whom 21 people responded) and one field trip.

When I began writing the show I became stuck on the idea of lying as a decoy. For my own amusement I decided to visit a hunting shop and buy a mallard decoy duck. It was the first (and last) time I had ever been to a hunting shop. The shop was bustling with people preparing to hunt – buying hunting outfits (hats in particular), guns (of course), bullets, lures, flares and game callers. There were two big wire crates full of plastic mallard ducks, I bought one; it was a simple exchange that lasted 45 minutes.

Initially I thought the duck would serve as a muse and help with the writing, however, when I returned to the studio it became immediately apparent that the duck would be a key collaborator.

BIOGRAPHIES

Rosie Dennis is a Sydney-based artist. She makes work that is technically simple, emotionally evocative and has a strong connection with the everyday. Her work has been presented at dance, theatre, live art and poetry festivals in the United Kingdom and Central Europe. Since 2007 she has received a number of new work commissions including: Künstlerhaus Mousonturm for The Plateaux Festival, Frankfurt; Arnolfini / InBetween Time Festival, UK; Performance Space, Sydney; Campbelltown Arts Centre, The Strand Ephemera Festival, Townsville; ABC TV and Channel 4 (UK). In addition to Rosie's performance work she has taught for the Department of Juvenile Justice, Holroyd City Council, Auburn Migrant Resource Centre, STARTTS (Service for the Treatment and Rehabilitation of Torture and Trauma Survivors) and PCYC. When not performing she is employed as the Live Art Curator for Campbelltown Arts Centre.

Simon Ferenci is a Sydney-based trumpet player who works in a variety of styles, especially jazz and improvised music. In 2003 at the age of 20 he was a finalist in the National Jazz Awards (held at the Wangaratta Festival of Jazz) and in 2004 graduated from the Sydney Conservatorium of Music with a Bachelor of Music (Jazz Performance) degree. He currently leads and composes for the Simon Ferenci Quartet, and also plays in numerous jazz and improvising groups such as the Sean Coffin Quintet, Paul Derricott's Arrow, Jazzgroove Mothership Orchestra and the Splinter Orchestra. He has performed and/or recorded with bands including The Beautiful Girls, Watussi, The Panics, The Herd and Joanna Newsom.
