CHOREOGRAPHER'S NOTE

The show 'looks' at perception in two directions—outward and inward. I am interested in finding ways to move the audience's perception beyond what the eye sees. In order to perceive relationships, interactions and dependencies to a greater ecology that connects us all to each other, we have chosen to build the work in real time. The music is predominantly

composed from the sounds captured during the actual performance. A feedback loop is generated between performer and composer, visual and sonic, creating a dynamic relationship where one cannot exist without the other.

Looking inward, going deeper and smaller into something, can open up an enormous space. The vast hidden terrain of our internal environment requires delicate navigation and observation. Between internal and external spaces we traverse moving thresholds (or prosceniums) of spatial, sonic and directional relations.

Carlee Mellow over the last 15 years has worked in both film and live performance as a dancer, actor and collaborator with many choreographers and directors, touring nationally and internationally. Her choreographic work has been presented in Melbourne and Berlin and includes commissions by Dance Works (2006), Natalie Cursio's 'The Album Project' at the Victorian Arts Centre (2007) and Lucy Guerin Inc. (2008). She has been Artist in Residence at Gasworks Arts Park (2002) and Footscray Community Arts Centre (2007). Her choreography for theatre and opera includes Arena Theatre's Girl Who Cried Wolf (2008), The Malthouse Theatre, Arena Theatre's co-production of Goodbye Vaudeville Charlie Mudd (2009) and Oz Opera's production of La Traviata (2010). Most recently Carlee presented her adaptation of In The Dark, by the acclaimed U.S choreographer Deborah Hay at Dancehouse and choreographed Simmer for The Substation's season produced by Kath Papas for Melbourne Fringe Festival.

Kelly Ryall is a multi award winning composer, sound artist and devisor, working in the realm of film, theatre and dance. His primary interest in music and sound is creating work that is immersive and visceral with the aim of taking listeners on a journey through their own internal and external landscapes. He has worked with most of the largest theatre companies in Australia including, STC, MTC, Company B, Malthouse Theatre and has received 3 Green Room awards and the Melbourne Fringe "Melbourne Arts Festival" award. He has created work alongside visual artists for gallery installations and has written scores for a number of short films and commercial projects.

Bluebottle is a design consultancy and project management company, specialising in lighting, set and installations. Bluebottle have been designing in creative and unconventional ways in dance, theatre, galleries, museums, installations, music and exhibitions since 1992. We are interested in extending the possibilities of design and the integration of light and the surrounding environment. Bluebottle draws upon the experience of talented staff to produce the finest outcome for any project undertaken and we love a challenge. Bluebottle has won many awards for their designs, including the John Truscott Award for Excellence in Design. Margaret Cameron is a writer, director, performer and teacher. She received the Australia Council Theatre Fellowship in 2004, The Gloria Dawn and Gloria Payten Fellowship in 1997 and The Eva Czajor Memorial Award For Female Directors in 1998. Her works are situated somewhere between performance art and theatre and have been produced by LaMama Theatre, The Playbox, Malthouse Theatre, Dancehouse and Aphids in Melbourne and The Deborah Hay Dance Company, Austin, Texas, Radio Austria (ORF), Podewil Theatre, Berlin, The Ludwig Forum for International Art, Germany, ABC Radio, Transit Denmark, Magdalena Australia, USA and Barcelona. Her processes traverse a range of contemporary inter-arts performance practices working with notions of paradox, hypothesis and congruence to energize choreography, scenography and a dynamic composition of performance elements. Margaret is currently Resident Director with Chamber Made Opera, Melbourne.
