Back to Back Theatre's last four major works - Soft (2002), small metal objects (2005), Food Court (2008) and Ganesh Versus the Third Reich (2011) have all premiered to critical and audience acclaim at Melbourne International Arts Festival. Ganesh Versus the Third Reich won the 2009 Kit Denton Fellowship for Courageous Writing, the 2011 Age Critics' Award for best new Australian work at the Melbourne Festival. and three Green Room Awards - for Best Ensemble Performance (Alternative and Hybrid Performance), Best Direction (Theatre) and Best Production (Theatre).

Over the last five years alone Back to Back Theatre has toured to 49 cities around the world. Based in Geelong, it is now one of Australia's most globally recognised and respected contemporary theatre companies.

HELL HOUSE

Each year in the American mid-west, many communities engage in a unique form of community theatre via a faithinspired production titled Hell House. The promenade performance takes the form of a haunted-house tour, in which

each room is themed around a sin such as drug-taking, sex before marriage, abortion. drink-driving and homosexuality. Hell House presents a very black-and-white moral world, where a wrong decision might send you to hell. The production is designed to scare young audiences in an attempt to reconfirm their commitment to the Christian faith.

A HISTORY OF HELL HOUSE

The earliest Hell House is thought to have been created by Trinity Assembly of God in Dallas, Texas, but it was first popularised by Jerry Falwell in the late 1970s. More recently the concept has been promoted and adapted by Keenan Roberts, who started a Hell House in Arvada, Colorado, in 1995. He is now the senior pastor of Destiny Church of the Assemblies of God, where Hell House is performed each year during the month of October, to an audience of approximately 13,000 young people.

Pastor Roberts's Hell House script is downloadable in kit form with howto production information including marketing, direction for casting and performance, set design, prop lists and 'effect' recipes for making - among other things - fake blood. The detailed

quidelines offer a complete A-to-Z schematic of how to realise the production, from pre-production through to public relations.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

Back to Back Theatre has used the Hell House guidelines faithfully, in their entirety, to present Hell House - Provocation, Belief & Morality as an anthropological study of a particular faith-based community theatre of Middle America. Our aim is to present the work as a museum would exhibit a religious artefact.

What we seek to present is not solely a theatrical spectacle, but a series of three public conversations which are mediated by the spectacle that is Hell House.

To realise our objectives, Back to Back Theatre has collaborated with 50 volunteer actors from the Geelong and south-west Victorian community. As the presenters of this Hell House, we as a community face the political, spiritual and moral position of 'the other' - another community's religious beliefs - and in doing so we seek to understand our own position.

Back to Back is not a faith-based organisation and has no intention to convert or inspire audiences to embrace Hell House's doctrine.

A writer for ABC Online, Eureka Street, The Times Literary Supplement and a number of academic journals, he also edited and translated (with Rex Butler) the best-selling two volumes of selected writings of Slovenian philosopher Slavoj Žižek. He is currently working on books with theologian John Milbank (on theology and civil society) and New Yorker literary critic James Wood (on literature and the presence/absence of God).
