

Our background is as theatre artists, but our interest in pushing the form has led us away from stages and theatre buildings and a traditional audience-performer relationship, towards a relationship that puts the audience member in the centre of a personalised experience.

We do this by shaping and re-framing the world that the audience find themselves in. Our works re-frame that 'world' in a variety of ways: through audio soundtracks and headsets; through locative mobile films; through live radio broadcasts; live encounters; through city and natural locations; and by engaging the audience's imagination, feelings and actions as contributing elements to the overall experience of the work. This results in experiences that allow the audience to re-see - the world, their environment, and often themselves.

Created with and featuring two futurists, *Carnival of Futures* is conceived as a provocation responding to challenges facing us all – environmental, technological, fiscal, political and social – through the prisms of two types of practice: that of artists, and that of futurists, engaging the audience in reflection, play, action and forward dreaming. It is an opportunity for the audience to pause and imagine, to reflect on their own personal relationship to the future. We began our research into this area with a workshop run by two futurists - Bridgette Engeler and Jose Ramos - so that we could experience their practice as a starting point for making this work. We were so struck by who they were as people and practitioners that we decided to put them in the show as non-performers 'performing' the art of being a futurist.

Presently, there is a greater than ever focus on not only climate change but also an awareness of other future changes (particularly technological) to which we all must respond. Our hope is that this work provides an opportunity to dream forward, reflect and ask questions.

He is currently the senior consulting editor for the Journal of Future Studies, and has over 50 publications spanning economic, cultural foresight and political change. Jose is an honorary fellow with the Centre for Cultural Diversity and Wellbeing. Jose's practice helps people and organizations bring their preferred futures into the present through experiments that can be scaled for impact. His work helps people generate breakthroughs, deep learning, an inner confidence in the ability to solve problems, and a shift toward an empowered future-facing culture.

She led the Creative Europe project Hotel Obscura (2014-2016) & presented festival works in Austria, France and Greece. In 2016 Katerina was awarded an Australia Council Theatre Fellowship (2017-2019) and is currently developing a new slate of works in Australia, Austria, Germany, Finland, Norway, Singapore & the UK.


