Refuge 2019 is a rolling program of talks, walks and feasts where you can quiz experts, meet your neighbours and learn from Traditional Owners who have already survived many climate catastrophes.

#### **North Melbourne School of Displacement**

31 Aug - 5 Sep

A series of discussions co-programmed by artist Keg de Souza and Wirlomin Noongar writer Claire G. Coleman housed in masses of salvaged tents, this school promotes learning as a key tool in the fight for social justice.

**Shelter – Weaving Workshop** Join Giant Grass and the weavers to explore different weaving techniques to imagine what a Melbourne-centric disaster shelter could look like.
