A call for dance festival projects

Overview

A new biennial dance festival 1-31 March 2023 is coming. This will be the festival's pilot year; an experiment.

This is a call for dance artists to propose ideas and projects for the festival to be supported, presented, and realised by up to 11A Festival Partners.

The festival will feature all kinds of dance projects: shows, talks, films, public programs, sharings, workshops, labs, dinners, publications, gatherings, installations — both in-person and digitally. Dance projects must be led by independent dance artists and small to medium dance companies based in Australia. International collaborators are welcome.

The festival will comprise programming from multiple Festival Partner organisations. Each Festival Partner also commits to programming works by independent artists, selected via this Expression of Interest and reviewed by a centralised festival Curatorium.

March 2023 is very soon. Considering the timeline and resources available, the festival and its projects will be small-scale. All festival projects must be able to be realised by the festival partner's existing resources — there may be no additional grant funding available to you.

This call for projects is a short (1 page) submission but please consider your dance project carefully. Read this document for some prompts and information about the Festival Partners, what sorts of projects they seek, and the resources they can make available for projects.

Your project will be appraised by an independent artistic Curatorium of 20 artists who may encourage Festival Partners to meet you and consider producing and presenting your project.

All ideas and projects remain the intellectual property of the submitting artist.

Members of the festival Curatorium will hold Zoom briefings to answer your questions on **5pm**, **Monday 13 June**; and **5pm**, **Monday 20 June**. Register to attend those briefings or receive the recordings here.

What is the Festival?

Biennially, from March 2023, a new dance festival will be created through the collaboration and collective organisation of independent dance artists and organisations to celebrate and convene audiences and communities.

The festival (name TBC) is an evolving and transformative congregation for audiences, artists and partners. The festival seeks to represent dance artists from across forms, practices, cultures, histories, lineages, styles, disciplines, anti-disciplines, aesthetics and experimentations.

The festival is interested in all kinds of dance projects, all of equal importance: shows, talks, films, public programs, sharings, and workshops both in-person and online.

This festival is adaptive and will respond to current conditions in its scale and ambition over a 10-year cycle. It aligns and supports an arts community both recovering from, and preparing for, large-scale shifts in how the arts, climate crisis, and global mobility intersect.

The festival in 2023 will be a small pilot festival — an opportunity to test ideas and models. We are launching with a prototype that reflects the co-designed principles and framework. We are however, limited by resources, time and the capacity of artists and Festival Partners at this transitional time.

This festival, like its predecessor Dance Massive, is created by the collective will and cooperation of the dance sector comprising artists, organisations, arts workers, producers, presenters, advocates, communities and stakeholders. The festival has no central operations, no individual governing organisation, no ongoing year-round staff or resources.

There are two important roles which help direct and deliver the Festival:

THE PARTNERS: are the 16 organisations for the 2023 festival who adhere to the festival's principles and framework. The Partners agree to contribute resources for the creation of the festival and to produce and present multiple artistic projects.

THE CURATORIUM: are 20 making dance artists appointed and paid by the Partners with a responsibility to take a festival-wide-view. The Curatorium facilitates a call-out for projects by artists and appraises these ideas.

Please provide one project per submission.

Artists may submit up to **two project EOIs** for the Curatorium to consider.

Each EOI may nominate one or more Festival Partners which the project may be suitable for.

The Expression of Interest form uses Airtable. You don't need to log-in or set-up an account.

The form requires some basic contact information and then requires you to upload a 1 page "YOUR PROJECT" document (Word or PDF only).

The "YOUR PROJECT" attachment is the critical component of the submission and can be expressed in a format that best supports you and your project. It must be no more than **1 page lon**g. If you'd like to respond in audio or video, you may do so and provide links in the word or PDF attachment.

The Curatorium encourages you to pitch your project succinctly — shorter is better.

No budget is required but please outline the resources you have and/or might require for the project.

THE "YOUR PROJECT" DOCUMENT (1 page)

You can write the "YOUR PROJECT" document in the way that suits you. The content is important — your formatting or design skills are not.

YES, you may include a link to a film in this document of you talking to camera. YES, you can include pictures, links, references, writing, drawings.

We strongly encourage you to include a link in the document to past or current dance material (e.g. video of rehearsal, showing, performance) of no longer than 2 minutes.

If your stuck on how to write the 1 page "YOUR PROJECT" document, try these headings and prompts:

- **ABOUT YOU** Who are you? What do you make? What kind of dance do you make? What is your artistic lineage? Who is your team on this project? Who are your collaborators? A link to 2 minutes of video material of your dance material.
- **YOUR IDEA** What is the project about; its creative impetus? What is it investigating? What are your choreographic tools or processes? Who is your audience? Why is it interesting?
- YOUR PROJECT How do you imagine the project will be presented? What form will it take? What would audiences experience? Where, when, how, and how often does it happen? What stage of development is the project at?
- YOUR CONTEXT Does your project suit a particular context, community, audience, time of day, or space?
- **RESOURCES** What resources do you have and what do you need? What is the size of your team? Is it ready to go, or does it need development or rehearsal? Resources may include cash, people, spaces, equipment, time, access requirements, catering, travel and accommodation. You may indicate that you already have resources or funding.

Creative Appraisal

The Curatorium will review all EOIs received. They will then meet together to discuss the projects and provide recommendations to the Festival Partners.

The Curatorium will prioritise EOIs that best meet the principles and framework for the festival and that are exciting and viable for the Festival Partners. Care will be taken to ensure a diverse, rich and engaging festival for audiences offering a variety of opportunities and ways to experience dance.

Partners will review the feedback from the Curatorium and will contact artists directly to discuss their projects. These discussions are an opportunity for artists and Festival Partners to discuss the potential for collaborating together and to seek more information about logistics, resources, requirements and mutual interest.

The Festival Partners are not obliged to take any projects from the EOI. The Curatorium will advocate for projects and will be influential for Festival Partners. Festival Partners will work with artists directly if the project is eventually confirmed and produced as a festival activity.

You will be notified if your project has been recommended by the Curatorium to Festival Partner/s. No further feedback will be available.

Important Information to Consider

- Your project must have a public outcome. This is primarily a festival for audiences.
- The Festival is a partnership between organisations and presenting venues. You may contact these partners about their individual offer but there isn't a central place or person to call about this EOI. Please bring questions to the Zoom briefings on the 13 and 20 June.
- Partners and their financial capacity change radically depending on the project's requirements e.g. size of team, potential earned box office, how many shows, location/ space, duration, and equipment will all have an impact. Please consider this when pitching your project.
- Each partner has outlined the types of projects they seek and what they can offer in this overview document. Please review this carefully when considering which partners may suit you and your project.
- This is a dance festival with dance projects. You are welcome to define "dance" in its broadest term.
- The artist Curatorium will not read beyond the 1 page limit.
- Your project should assume that all artists are paid professional rates by the partner. Allowances and
 accessibility provision should also be accounted for (e.g. travel, accommodation, per diems, transfers,
 childcare, translators, support workers). Please consider that many Partners will be limited by their size and
 financial capacity.
