This show is a **55-minute-long semi participatory performance**. The **performance happens in transit** throughout the main hall, the **audience will transfer** from the stage area into the seating bank and be invited back onto the stage at a later point.

Blending **street dance, gaming and digital technology**, GG brings performers and avatars together in a **live interactive world**. The show **explores power, control, collaboration and choice**, asking who gets to lead, who gets followed, and how change happens. **Audiences have the option to take part in the experience**, becoming part of the live exchange between dancers, game systems and digital characters as the performance unfolds.

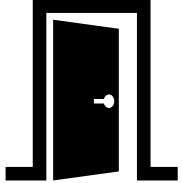

Our Box Office desk at North Melbourne Town Hall also opens 60 minutes before performance start times for **in person** bookings.

Please check ticket availability ahead of time to avoid disappointment.

Please note there is a \$3.00 transaction fee for paid events. This is applied once per transaction.

Ticket Types

Access Services

We list certain access services as ticket types e.g. Auslan, Audio Description, Wheelchair seating.

These are full tickets to the show, NOT add-ons.

We sell tickets this way as it helps our team and the service providers we work with anticipate numbers and offer a better service.

Reduced

Our Reduced ticket type is equivalent to Concession pricing. This ticket type is open to anyone who may be facing barriers to attend the arts. We do not ask for any proof or verification.

BLAKTIX

For every ticketed event, Arts House ensures discounted tickets are available for First Nations people. You can book BLAKTIX online when purchasing tickets to any event.

Companion Card

Arts House supports the Companion Card program. You can book your companion ticket online when purchasing tickets to any show. Only the person whose photograph and details appear on the Companion Card can use the card.

COVID-19 and Viral Safety

You **must not attend** our venue or programs in person if you have any signs of transmissible illness such as:

- a cough
- sore throat
- fever
- shortness of breath
- flu-like symptoms

We will provide a refund if you need to cancel your attendance due to illness.

Please [contact us](#) by 9am on the day of the event. This helps our staff by letting them process your refund during off-peak times.

We cannot provide refunds to events that have already passed.

To minimise the risk of viral transmission, we encourage you to **wear a well fitted respirator** of P2 or comparable standards.

Outside of masked events/hours, this is not something Arts House enforces. Because of this, it is reasonable to expect that most others in the building will not be masking.

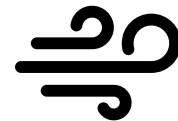

Getting to Arts House

Arts House is located in the North Melbourne Town Hall, at the corner of Queensberry Street and Errol Street in North Melbourne.

We have some resources that can help you with navigation throughout the building, including a [video guide](#) and a [verbal map](#).

Tram

From the CBD (Elizabeth St), Take the Route 57 tram and get off at Stop 12, North Melbourne Town Hall. Please note, this is not a level access tram stop and is not serviced by low floor trams.

Train

Arts House is 1.1 kilometres from North Melbourne Train Station (16 minute walk), 1.3 kilometres from Flagstaff Station (18 minute walk) or 1.2 kilometres from Arden Station (20 minute walk)

Car

There is paid street parking around Arts House. There are two accessible on-street car parking spaces on Queensberry Street and two more on Errol Street for holders of a Disability Parking Permit.

Walk

Arts House is 2.5 kilometres from Flinders Street Station, (35 minute walk), and 850 meters from Queen Victoria Markets (11 minute walk).

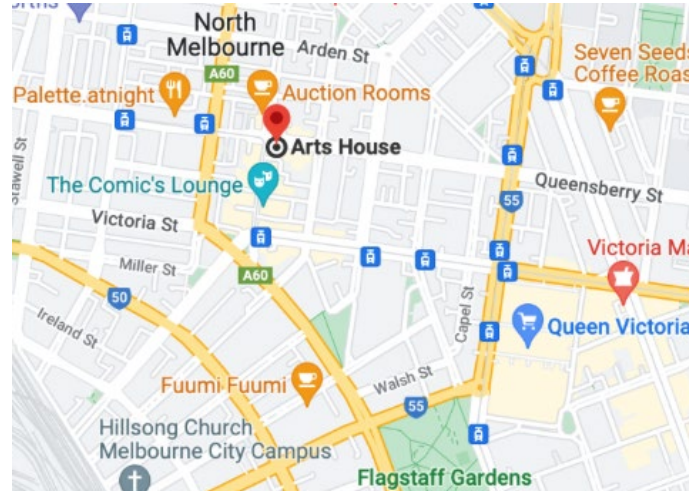

Queensberry Street Entrance

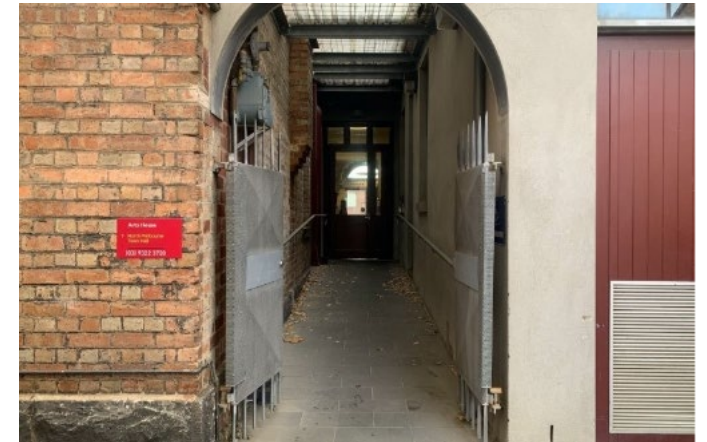

The Foyer

When you enter Arts House, you will find yourself in the foyer.

- Please gather and wait in the foyer if your show is in the Studios, Supper Room or the Main Hall.
- Information about upcoming events and performances is available on **posters** on the walls and on **a tablet computer** at the reception desk.
- Tickets for events can be reserved or purchased at the reception.
- There is **limited seating available**. Mostly, cushioned grey chairs.
- A **communication board** and **pen and paper** are available at reception.
- **Free Wi-Fi** is available for visitors.
- The foyer contains a **lift**.
- A **water cooler** is located nearby the reception desk.
- Arts House frequently commissions artists to present works in the foyer. There is **always something to see**.

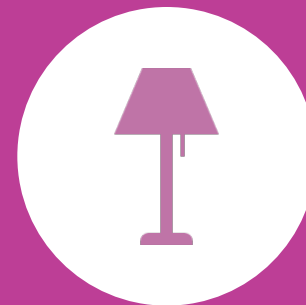

There are two bathrooms with showers and one with a baby change table on the upper level.

The nearest Changing Places facility is a 17 minute walk away at Narm Ngarrgu Library and Family Services

An artist statement is available on signage and content advice on the door.

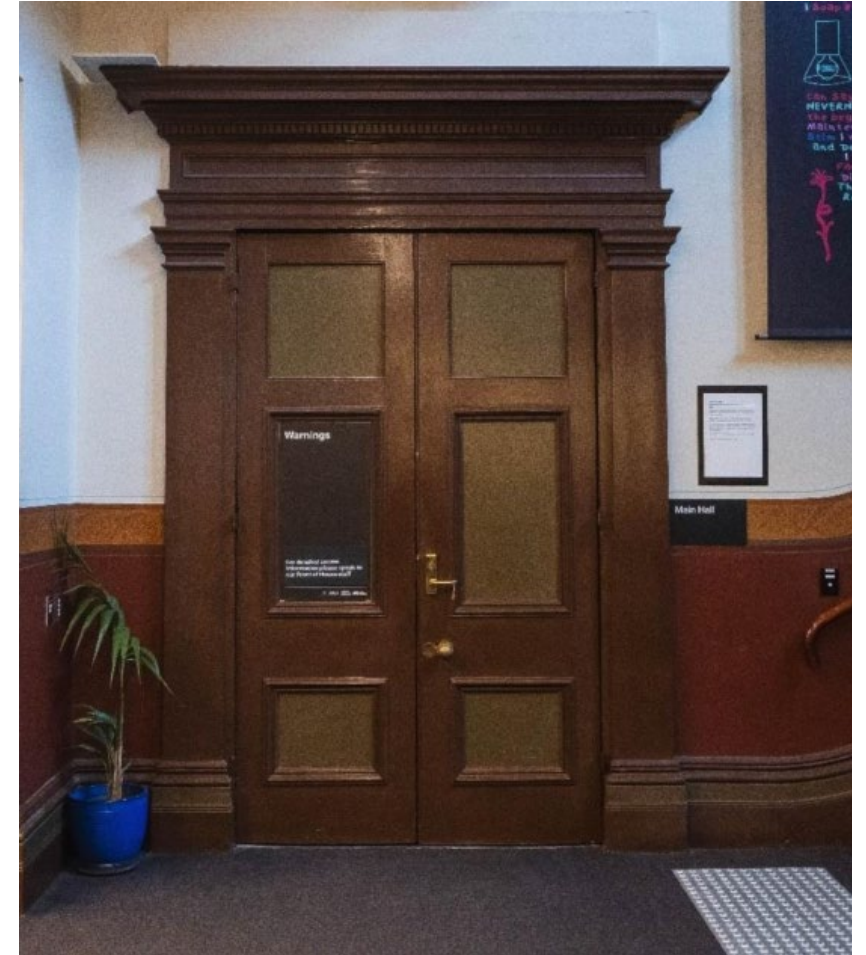

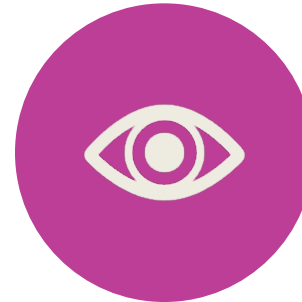

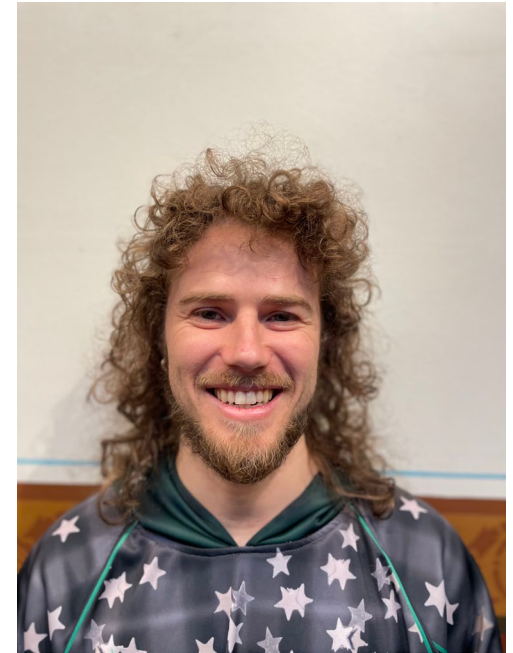
